They are helping to track the distribution of invasive plants and pests within your region. **Invasive species are organisms that are non-native to the current ecosystem, and cause or are likely to cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human/animal/plant health.**

The volunteers have been trained in identification and field techniques and are monitoring areas designated by the Invaders program to help paint a picture of invasive species spread in urban, rural, rangeland and wild (undisturbed) lands. Their investigations are part of a national effort to map target invasive species and assist land managers in their control and removal.
